Education is at the Heart of What we Stand For

Right now, head teachers across the UK are writing to the Government to protest at the lack of resources for education - while the Conservative Government is squandering money on "free" and "grammar" schools - we want to tell you what we think.

Education is the key to freedom and opportunity, and a vital part of creating the fairer society our Party seeks to build.

We believe in a society where every young person, from whatever background or circumstance, can grow up to achieve anything they set their mind to. It is a tragedy that in 21st Century Britain, the wealth of a child's parents and where they are born are still indicators of how well they will do at school. We strongly oppose the Government's plans to open divisive new grammar schools which will disproportionately benefit children from wealthier backgrounds.

To make sure every child gets the support they need, our education system must be properly funded. We were proud to introduce the Pupil Premium – extra money to support pupils from disadvantaged backgrounds – when we were in Government. Our policy is to protect school funding in real terms, from early years to college.

Our vision for education is about more than just passing exams. We should give children confidence, creativity and practical skills too. We are deeply concerned that children are increasingly missing out on subjects like art, music and sport. We want to see a broad, balanced curriculum in our schools which includes financial literacy, first aid and emergency lifesaving skills, citizenship, and age-appropriate sex and relationship education.

Access to education and new opportunities should not end at 18. We introduced a record number of apprenticeships in the last Parliament, to support people to gain new skills or change career at any age. We want to see greater investment in adult skills training and further education colleges.

Fundamentally, we also know that we cannot deliver the best education for all, when our teaching workforce is demoralised and undervalued. We are committed to working with education professionals to tackle the workload and recruitment challenges they face.

Shootersway Improvements Promised

Garrick Stevens and Berkhamsted Liberal
Democrats have been pushing for a solution to the

10 years. Now improvements to the road junction,
funded by nearby developments have been
promised - but these have not yet arrived.


Town Cllr Garrick Stevens said, "Of course we welcome these improvements but understand they


will not be in place until later this year.

Or will you choose a new, fresh team of young Liberal Democrats?


We say that it's time for a change in the way we're represented. Will you join us?

your compensation yet?

However you might have had difficulty applying.

In the last issue of the *Democrat* there was a link to the Southern Rail webpage that you need to reach in order to apply for compensation. We've just noticed this has been moved by Southern.

But don't leave it too long. The current scheme finishes at the end of April 2017.

Multi Storey Car Park in Berkhamsted

The Tories' plan for the Multi Storey Car Park in Berkhamsted has been delayed, but not stopped.



A group of concerned residents are seeking a judicial review on the Borough Council's decision to build their car park.

But the

Conservative Council is nevertheless determined to push on, despite serious flaws in their scheme.

Part of Berkhamsted's charm is its historic setting. It is still at heart a small town with a community atmosphere. Yet its narrow streets have led to traffic congestion especially around the junction of the High Street, Kings Road and Lower Kings Road. Putting a multi-story car park in Lower Kings Road will generate a large increase in traffic and add to the already bad congestion.

Delays at the traffic lights will have a knock-on effect on everyone who lives on the Castle side of town, as drivers exiting the car park will inevitably look for alternative routes.

Lower Kings road already suffers from increasing levels of pollution from Diesel engines and the regular traffic jams will put air pollution in breach of acceptable limits.

The cost of some $3\frac{1}{2}$ million is also not justified. The car park is not forecast to be full for 6 years. Although we have not been told what charges will apply, we have been told it will not recover the cost of construction for over 19 years.

Currently Berkhamsted benefits from a lot of free on-street parking, which is flexible for residents, workers and visitors. Although the Borough Council denies such plans, the only way it will be able to make the Multi Storey Car Park profitable, would be to introduce charges for on street parking and force people to use the new car park.

This would cause considerable problems and costs for everyone living in Berkhamsted.

Gossoms End A Local Resource for Local People

Whenever a review of NHS services is carried out, there is always a recommendation for health services to be made more accessible. The NHS also has a long term aspiration for more treatment, diagnosis and follow-up to be provided away from hospitals and closer to where people live.

One way to achieve this would be for more services to be provided at GP surgeries, but often, either the location is unsuitable or the premises are too small. Now the concept of "Health Hubs" is being suggested as a way to implement these changes either by converting a large enough existing building or by the constructing a purpose built Health Centre.

At present Gossoms End which is still

descibed as a "Community Hospital" - provides a 2-doctor GP practice, a base for community health staff and a number of clinics. The building also contains a 24-bed Rehabilitation Inpatient Unit but this is "temporarily closed" and is not expected to re-open in its earlier form.

Nigel said, "Having a valuable NHS asset already right here in the local community is an opportunity. If a Health Centre or a "Health Hub" could be provided on this site, then there would be a number of benefits.

Trips to hospitals could be reduced, local GP practices could expand into new premises and diagnostic tests, minor surgery and post-operative follow up carried out on the spot.

If elected I would work for better local heath facilities through the county Health & Wellbeing Board and the Health Scrutiny Committee"
